ON - campus OFF - campus

as a co-op student or intern as part of your study program

These are valuable experiences, but only the work you do after you graduate will count when you

apply for permanent residence.

That's why it's important to use the post-graduation work permit to get the kind of work experience that will make you eligible for an immigration program.

STEP 3. Purchase of GIC (Guaranteed Investment Certificate)


STEP 4. Undertake Medicals

- Visa Application Form
- Original valid passport with photocopy of the Biodata page
- Family information form
- An Acceptance Letter
- Use of Representative Form (IMM 5476)
- Proof of English Proficiency Test
- Academic Documents
- Receipt of Payment of Tuition fee
- Evidence of GIC purchase
- Student Questionnare
- Medical, etc.
